HOLY WEEK

Before Jesus enters Jerusalem for the final time, he looked out over the city and "he wept". Jesus knew his final hour was upon him.

"The very large crowd spread their cloaks on the road, while others cut branches from the trees and strewed them on the road. The crowds preceding him and those following kept crying out and saying: "Hosanna to the Son of David; blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord; hosanna in the highest.""

The people wanted a king, but they will reject Jesus as their king. He was not the strong warrior who would lead them into physical battles and vanquish all their enemies. He was the meek innocent lamb whose kingdom was not of this world. Our King is a mighty warrior who will lead us into battle against Satan and his cohorts.

Let us arm ourselves for spiritual battle: the sacraments, the rosary, and sacred scripture, must always accompany us, especially during Holy Week. Maintain an intense focus this week on Jesus. Keep your eyes on him and follow him wherever he leads you; keep your ears open and listen for his word to be spoken. Be acutely aware of the presence of Jesus in your life this Holy Week. The highlight of the week comes on Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Holy Saturday. If you are able to join us during the Sacred Triduum the holy liturgies will propel you more deeply into the sacred mystery.

Might I suggest more silence this week. Try to unplug from your media and plug into prayer. Hours of depressing news, mindless TV shows, video games, sports and countless other forms of entertainment can be eliminated or dramatically reduced this week and you will be better for it. Don't worry, you will survive from this detachment. Less noise will lead to a healthy silence so that you can better hear the voice of God. Like Jesus, we too might be brought to tears during Holy Week as we understand more fully what Jesus was asked to do by his Heavenly Father.
